Luke 19:28-40

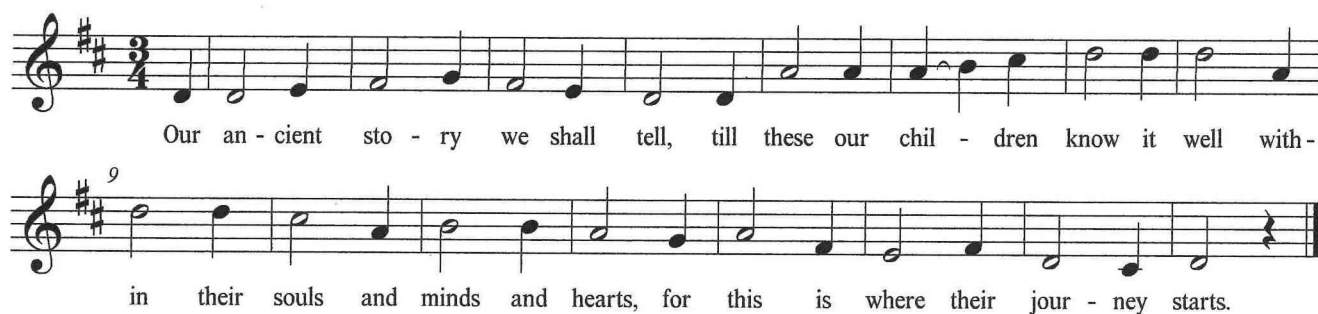

Peace in heaven, and glory in the highest heaven!" Some of the Pharisees in the crowd said to him, "Teacher, order your disciples to stop." ## **Easter Lilies**



## **Mission Possible**


