
## **Scripture Reading**





Diana Butler Bass's most recent book is *Freeing Jesus*, published March 30, 2021. Her secular friends often ask her "How can you still be a Christian?" In the book, she explains that her experience of Jesus has changed over the years, viewing him in different ways at different times. And that, though she is still a Christian, she isn't the same kind of Christian she used to be, or that they many think she is. *Freeing Jesus* explores the many images of Jesus we encounter and embrace through a lifetime—and how we make theology from the text of our lives in conversation with scripture and tradition. *Freeing Jesus* invites us to liberate Jesus and free ourselves when it comes to the ever-compelling and yet often-elusive figure at the center of Christian faith.

He continues to exhibit at art fairs and galleries throughout the region.
