



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Get in the Loop!

Hearing assistance is available during worship through your personal hearing aid and our Loop System. It requires that your hearing aid have a T-Coil which is also used for telephone hearing assistance. If you have a T-Coil in your hearing aid simply turn it on and our Loop System will connect automatically. Once connected, our service will be heard clearly through your hearing aid. If you do not have a T-Coil most Audiologists will install one in your hearing aid at no cost to you. Many buildings and events use the T-Coil and Loop System. 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Plymouth Hallway Art Gallery

Printmaker, writer and retired landscape architect, Stephen Perry has spent his life in appreciation of the natural landscape and has continually worked to interpret that appreciation to others. In his printmaking studio, Perry creates limited edition, mixed-media prints that depict the rural and natural landscape.

Stephen writes - I have worked with traditional copper plate etching, but in an effort to become more environmentally green, I have switched to photo-polymer plates used in varying techniques. Currently, I am creating my prints from hand-drawn original art which is then used to prepare the printing plate. I hand ink and pull an edition of black and white prints from that plate and then paint each print with watercolor. The resulting original prints are uniquely my own interpretation of the American landscape.

Plymouth Hallway Display Case

Nic Dikin and Annie Honn are both Kansas natives who graduated from Emporia State University with their bachelors of the Fine Arts. They have a combined experience of 18 years in blown glass. Nic began working with glass at age 16 and has ever since been honing his skills and pursuing his passion of art and fire.

Annie started her career with glass at 22 and since graduating has worked at Kansas City's Monarch Glass Studio and was involved in the building and initial teaching of Belger's public Glass Annex before fully transitioning into an independent artist back home in Wichita.

Glass blowing is very much a team effort and for a majority of their careers Nic and Annie have made the bulk of their work together. Both taking roles as assistant and gaffer to one another. Consistently, ideas and techniques are mirrored between the two artists creating a mesh of functional and solid work aiming to beautify everyday life. Inspiration is taken from Italian techniques to add linear patterns that dance across the surface and the transparent qualities of glass that mesmerize the eye.

Annie and Nic currently create work out of the studio at Karg Art Glass located in Kechi, Kansas. There you can see the artists working first hand to create objects out of molten glass into functional works of art.

From the Archives


The last time the NACCC Annual Meeting and Conference was held in Wichita was 1975.
