One: Happy is the nation whose God is the Lord, the people whom God has chosen as God's heritage.


All: The Lord looks down from heaven; and sees all humankind.

*Invocation and Lord's Prayer





Get in the Loop!

Hearing assistance is available during worship through your personal hearing aid and our Loop System. It requires that your hearing aid have a T-Coil which is also used for telephone hearing assistance. If you have a T-Coil in your hearing aid simply turn it on and our Loop System will connect automatically. Once connected, our service will be heard clearly through your hearing aid. If you do not have a T-Coil most Audiologists will install one in your hearing aid at no cost to you. Many buildings and events use the T-Coil and Loop System. The blue-ear logo below indicates that the building or event you are attending offers audio through the Loop System. Get a T-Coil and get in the Loop!
